We currently need items for our newborn/premature baby shoeboxes which are filled and wrapped in pretty paper. These boxes are distributed to new mums along with incubators, if required by Wendy Warrington, our contact in Ukraine

The following items for shoeboxes are in short supply!

BOOTEES & MITTENS

Baby cardigans/jackets and hats
Small baby blankets (without holes so fingers and toes can't get caught)
Small knitted toys to fit into shoeboxes



Soup and Soap



We are accepting tins of soup and bars of soap along with other non perishable food items including pet food.

The following items are also required for Winter:-

Warm winter clothes for adults and children including knitted items, hats, scarves, gloves etc.

Unwanted medical aids – wheelchairs, walking sticks/frames

Unused Medicines

Anything that the NHS will not accept back!!

**Household items - Cooking utensils, pots and pans etc.
Crocery, cutlery – any essential items required for day to day life!**

SEWING FOR THE BRANCH

Hello everyone. My name is Wendy Proctor and I live in Marchwood with my husband Mike and two crazy rabbits called Foggy and Misty. I was born in Southampton in 1945 and it was obvious from a very early age that I had somehow arrived with the “Knitting and Sewing Gene” firmly in place! As a teenager I enjoyed making my own clothes and later in married life children’s clothes and curtains etc. kept me busy.

In 2020 when “Covid” struck I started sewing in earnest production line mode. Myself and a loosely tied group of ladies in our village got together to help the NHS who were urgently seeking scrub bags. I made over 200 which were delivered in double quick time. We also made drip bags and heart shaped mastectomy pillows for the Princess Anne Hospital in Southampton. As a team we made thousands of face masks which were distributed across the New Forest. Many were given away to good causes and those sold raised much needed cash for local food banks. Thanks also are due to the generous gifts from villagers who searched their houses for spare material. Currently I am knitting purple hearts for Southampton General Hospital. These are given to the families of those who have lost loved ones.

When Covid ended I needed something else to keep me going! I started to make bags and cushions as well as gift items such as phone cases and other novelty items. Friends also started asking me to make things for them which is great and keeps me going. I find that sewing early in the morning before breakfast is that little bit of “Me time” which is very therapeutic.

Since I retired from Lloyds Bank over 20 years ago I have been volunteering as a classroom assistant for two mornings each week at Marchwood Junior School. Seven years ago I started a weekly lunchtime “knitting Club” for 7 to 10 year olds. This I love, it is so rewarding to see the faces of the boys and girls when they finish their projects, it’s amazing. Let’s hope that some will go on and discover that they also have the “Knitting and Sewing Gene”.

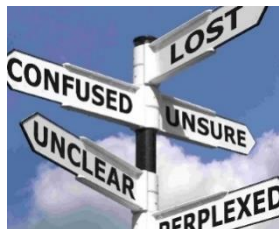
